

Frederick Brown was appointed Deputy Regional Administrator for Construction in the NRC's Region II office in Atlanta, in 2012. His responsibilities include oversight and assessment of all new reactor and fuel cycle facility construction in the United States.

Mr. Brown joined the NRC in 1994, holding positions in the Region III office in Illinois. In 2000, Fred moved to NRC's Headquarters where he held supervisory positions in the Medical and Nuclear Safety Program and the High Level Waste Program. He was named a Division Director in the Office of New Reactors and then the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation from 2006 until 2012. His Divisions had wide ranges of responsibilities, including programmatic ownership of the Reactor Oversight Process that the NRC uses to inspect and assess all operating power reactors.

Mr. Brown received a B.S. degree from the United States Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, N.Y., and is a graduate of the Senior Executive Service (SES) Candidate Development Program. Prior to joining the NRC, Fred held various engineering and management positions at the now closed Mare Island Naval Shipyard. He is a registered Mechanical Engineer in the State of California.
