This role is fast-paced and output-driven. You will write at least five stories a week, staying on top of breaking developments while consistently delivering clear, sharp reporting. Every six weeks, you will step back and go deeper, producing a feature that explores a trend, challenge, or opportunity in a way that moves industry thinking forward.

But this role does not stop at writing.

As you report, you will be expected to recognize when a story is bigger than an article. When something deserves a stage, you help bring it there. The ideas, tensions, and breakthroughs you uncover should translate into conference panels, workshops, and even keynotes. You will work alongside our events team, who will handle execution, while you focus on shaping content that matters. If you want to go deeper into conference development, the door is open.

You will be surrounded by a team that is both creative and deeply experienced in the industry. We have the expertise. We have the access. The opportunity now is to build something that reaches further, including into a more consumer-facing platform that helps people understand the real impact and value of recycling and reuse.

Over time, success in this role means becoming a trusted voice in the space. Someone industry leaders call. Someone who understands not just what is happening, but why it matters and where it is going. As the electronics recycling and ITAD sectors evolve, you will evolve with them.

This is a role for someone who is curious, driven, and not afraid of volume or complexity. Someone who can move quickly without losing depth. Someone who wants to build expertise, not just accumulate clips.

If you're looking for a position where you can grow into a subject matter expert, shape industry conversations, and be part of a team that is pushing beyond traditional media, this is that opportunity.
